

Campton Township Solid Waste Disposal District (CTSWDD)
Meeting Minutes for the Public Forum February 1, 2020, 9:00AM – 11:00AM
Held at Campton Township Community Center, 5N082 Old LaFox Rd., Campton
Hills, Illinois 60175

A. Call to Order

Steven Cartwright called the Public Forum of the Campton Township Solid Waste Disposal District to order at 9:00 a.m. Trustees Larry Gallagher and Joe Drago were in attendance. Katie Neary, Municipal Manager for Lakeshore Recycling Systems attended.

B. Pledge of Allegiance

Steve Cartwright led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

C. Welcome General Public and Guests

D. Introduction of CTSWDD Board Members and LRS Personnel.

President Cartwright introduced Larry, Joe and Katie.

E. Brief History of CTSWDD

President Cartwright reviewed the history and purpose of CTSWDD.

F. Reason for RFP and Resulting change in waste haulers to LRS.

President Cartwright reviewed the three reasons he thought that doing a Request for Proposal was required for the April 1, 2020 through March 31, 2025 contract. He reviewed the process used to prepare and review the RFP and proposed Agreement, including the use of an outside consultant and legal review. Reviewed how the board determined who would receive a request for proposal, the RFPs went to Waste Management, Advanced, Food Brothers, Groot and LRS. We received four proposals back, WM, Advanced, Groot and LRS.

He noted that the proposals were analyzed based on the criteria in the RFP and Lakeshore's proposal was determined to be the best proposal for the District.

President Cartwright reviewed the pricing for the unlimited service which 78% of the residents use. Current WM pricing \$22.46 per month, LRS price for 2020/2021 \$19.95 per month, Groot 2020/2021 price \$23.99 per month, Advanced price \$24.25 per month and Waste Management price of \$28.30 per month. He presented the financial impact over the 5 years for the base services, Lakeshore \$6,527m, Groot \$7,638m or \$1,110m higher than LRS, Advanced \$8,051m or \$1,523m higher than LRS, Waste Management \$9,022m or \$2,494m higher than LRS.

He noted that the board finalized an agreement in December 2019 and it was signed at the January 18th board meeting.

He noted that we have been working with LRS on the transition plan and LRS would use a 5 day pickup schedule.

G. Presentation by Lakeshore Recycling Systems

Katie Neary provided the new brochure covering the base service options, recycling cart options, Yard Waste and organics collection, service stickers and electronic waste (E-Waste) annual home event and collection day map.

She also discussed the signup process, cart selection process and additional services the LRS will provided over and above the current WM services.

H. Public Comments and Questions

The attendees were given the chance to ask questions about the pricing, service levels and additional services being provided. Several questions about why WM increased their prices so much, which we could not answer. President Cartwright gave everyone a chance to ask questions and we answered the questions that we could. President Cartwright had a question about any additional charges and he said that the CTSWDD board would institute a monthly franchise fee of \$0.05 per month and that the CTSWDD board was looking at having a Household Hazardous /Recycling fee in the \$0.25 - \$0.30 per month range. There were several people who came after the meeting was concluded and Trustee Gallagher answered their questions.

I. CTSWDD thinking on Household Hazardous Waste collection.

President Cartwright talked about the Kane County household hazardous waste program and how it works. He also discussed the other programs and their costs. Updated them on the Kane County approval process requirements for CTSWDD to offer this program. The earliest it would be available would be July 1, 2020.

J. Kane County long term funding of their monthly recycling programs.

President Cartwright said that Kane County was looking at how they are funding the monthly county wide recycling programs and they will be changing how it is funded in the future. Their current funding sources are being reduced and additional funding may have to come from the waste districts or municipalities.

K. Other Public Comments

No other questions were asked.

L. Meeting Adjournment

President Cartwright thanked the attendees for coming to the meeting and for their questions.
