Dear Mr. Phillips:

I am pleased to provide you with this proposal to assist the Campton Township Solid Waste Disposal District review its residential waste hauling contract options and assist in choosing a contractor once the current contract expires in May 2015. The proposed scope of work and estimated cost are addressed below.

Scope of Work

My scope of work associated with this project will include the following:

- Reviewing the District's current contract and pricing, and providing the District
 with written comments on the contract terms and the rates as compared to other
 similar contracts.
- Meeting (assume 1 meeting) with the District to outline its options regarding the
 residential hauling contract (i.e., negotiate an extension with the existing hauler or
 issue a Request for Proposals to multiple haulers).
- Meeting (assume 1 meeting) with the District and its current hauler to discuss a
 possible extension and to obtain a proposal from the hauler for an extension.
- Reviewing the proposed extension and providing a recommendation to the District on whether to negotiate an extension or issue an RFP.
- Based on the decision made by the District, either assist in negotiations to extend the contract or prepare and issue an RFP to known haulers in the area.
- If an RFP is issued, assist in evaluating the responses and participate in any subsequent interviews and negotiations (assume 2 meetings), and assist the District's legal counsel with final contract preparation.
 - If an extension is recommended by the District, assist the District's legal counsel with final contract preparation.

The proposed scope of work is dependent on the option chosen by the District to either negotiate an extension or issue an RFP. The RFP option will involve more time, and therefore my costs will be higher for this option due to the time commitment.

Proposed Budget

I will invoice the District on a time and materials basis with a not-to-exceed budget for the above scope of work of \$2,500 (hourly rate of \$150) for a contract extension and \$4,500 if an RFP is issued. This budget will not be exceeded without the prior approval of the District.
